Scholarship for Clarke DS Fellows

The Josef Korbel School of International Studies (Korbel) will waive the application fee for Clarke DS Fellows applying for admission to its eligible master's degree programs. Fellows who enroll in an eligible degree program will also receive:

- Scholarships of up to 40% of the annual tuition to help cover tuition costs funded by the Clarke DS Fellowship tuition assistance.
- Scholarships to cover the required DU student health insurance fee.

Clarke DS Fellows should indicate on their application for admission that they are applying as a Clarke DS Fellow.

The scholarships are awarded for the first year of study and are renewable in the second year provided the student remains a Clarke DS Fellow in good academic standing in their approved degree program and maintains a minimum 3.2 GPA.

Eligible Programs

Clarke DS Fellows are eligible to enroll in the following two-year (fall, winter and spring quarters), full-time master's degree programs offered by Korbel:

- Master of Arts Master of Arts in Global Economic Affairs
- Master of Arts in Global Environmental Sustainability
- Master of Arts in International Development
- Master of Arts in International Human Rights
- Master of Arts in International Security
- Master of Arts in International Studies
- Master of Arts in Public Policy

Admission Requirements at Korbel

To apply to the Korbel as a Clarke DS Fellow, you must:

- Complete the [online application](#)
- Upload required documentation, including:
 - Official transcript of the baccalaureate degree-granting institution showing the date of the degree conferral
 - Other program-specific admission materials. Some programs require additional information such as letters of recommendation, essays, and documentation of experience.
 - A copy of the email or letter confirming that you were selected as a Clarke DS Fellow to waive your application fee.

Admission to graduate studies at Korbel and any of its sponsored programs is open to qualified individuals without regard to race, color, national origin, religion, gender, disability, or age.
