The scholarships cover the cost of mandatory health insurance and assist with optional meal plan costs.

Benefits for Clarke DS Fellows

UNLV will waive the out-of-state tuition for Clarke DS Fellows enrolling in its eligible master's degree programs, charging only the in-state tuition fee, which is fully covered by the Clarke DS Fellowship tuition assistance. Additionally, UNLV will waive the application fee for Clarke DS Fellows.

Clarke DS Fellows enrolled in UNLV's eligible master's degree programs will also receive a scholarship that will cover the costs of:

- The mandatory Graduate Student Health Insurance, allowing Clarke DS Fellows to purchase the health insurance with no out-of-pocket expense.
- The 90-meal Commuter Plan, should the Clarke DS Fellows choose to purchase a meal plan.

These benefits are awarded for the first year of study and are renewable in the second year provided the student remains a Clarke DS Fellow in good academic standing in their approved degree program and maintain a minimum 3.2 GPA.

Eligible Programs

Clarke DS Fellows are eligible to enroll in the following four-semester (fall and spring), full-time master's programs offered by UNLV:

- Master of Science in Management Information Systems
- Master of Science in Computer Science
- Master of Science in Cybersecurity

Application for Admission to UNLV

UNLV will waive its application fee. Applicants to UNLV should indicate on their application and resumé that they are applying for the Clarke DS Fellowship. The following are UNLV's admission requirements:

Applicants must hold a four-year baccalaureate from a regionally accredited institution or approved equivalent. Applicants must also have a minimum overall grade point average of 2.75 for the bachelor's degree or a minimum 3.0 for the last two years (60 semester hours).

To apply to UNLV, prospective students must submit the following materials:

- Online application
- GRE (or GMAT) score report from ETS (optional, but strongly recommended)
- Transcripts from each post-secondary institution attended, showing all degrees and coursework, the dates awarded, and grades received.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation
- Statement of purpose (essay)
- Resume

Students are granted admission on the basis of academic achievement, performance on the entrance exam, experience in the proposed field of study, leadership experience, how well their goals align with the program of interest, and recommendations that indicate they are capable of excelling in a rigorous master's program. No single factor guarantees or prevents admission; all factors are weighed in the process.

Prerequisites for Enrollment at UNLV

Admitted students will need to provide the following information to finalize enrollment:

- Official, final transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended showing all degrees and coursework, dates awarded, and grades received.
- Immunizations
- Register for at least 9 credits per semester to be considered full-time
