Scholarships for FAIT Fellows

Susquehanna University (Susquehanna) will provide FAIT Fellows enrolling or currently enrolled in its eligible bachelor's degree programs with a merit-based scholarship for an amount equal to the difference between the Susquehanna tuition and the FAIT Fellowship tuition assistance.

Susquehanna Eligible Undergraduate Degree Programs

The following bachelor's degree programs are eligible for the undergraduate FAIT Fellowship program. Students must be enrolled full-time and be on a timeline to graduate after completing four full-time semesters (fall and spring) during their two-year fellowship.

Undergraduate Degree Programs

- · Bachelor of Arts in Computer Science
- · Bachelor of Science in Computer Science
- · Bachelor of Science in Data Science

Applying to Susquehanna

To apply to Susquehanna, prospective students must follow the steps outlined for undergraduate admissions:

Undergraduate Degree Programs

- Complete the Susquehanna University Application or the Common Application
- Official high school transcript, school report, and recommendation letter.
- Optional SAT/ACT Scores: Applicants can choose to submit their SAT or ACT exam scores (or both) but can also decide to apply without submitting scores under Susquehanna University's test-optional plan. Applicants can indicate this preference on the Susquehanna University Application or the Common Application. Susquehanna University uses a holistic review process to evaluate applications for admission because the application is more than students' SAT or ACT scores.
